

with farm visits throughout the South East which exposed us to a range of farming enterprises running beef, dairy, sheep and pigs. We were exposed to a range of herd health scenarios including calf rearing, heifer management, infertility, feedlot management, bull management and pre-weaning mortalities. We also had the opportunity to examine some animals on an individual level taking part in some foot trimming, clinical examinations, pregnancy testing, and even an LDA surgery. These experiences exposed us to a range of management practices and allowed us some cases. Our evenings were also kept busy with tutorial sessions, a DairySA farmer's dinner where Kiro spoke about mastitis and colostrum management, and finally a vet dinner where the local vets shared some cases of interest and friendly tips for veterinary practice.

We were able to gain an incredible amount of knowledge during the trip including a lot of things that can't be found in a textbook or a university lecture. There were several highlights dur-



gained insight into the research trials ing the week including Lauren scoring herself a free bottle of wine from one farm whilst admiring their vineyards, the 4:30am start in order to practice our pregnancy testing skills, and discovering that trying to squash a garbage bag full of rubbish through a 15 x 10cm bin opening is much like trying to replace a prolapsed uterus. However, one of the most memorable experiences was a discussion on calf rearing at one particular dairy farm. Whilst the farmer claimed he had no current issues that we could help him with he was quite keen to offer up some tips for our future careers. The use of woodchips for casting broken legs and the use of flour and water to help stop calf scours as in the farmer's own words, 'it's like making a scone in the calf' were particularly noteworthy.





Semester 2 Exams

Check your student email and the official timetable for any changes! http://www.adelaide.edu.au/student/exams/timetable.html

You are required to bring with you to the exam venue:

- your student ID (or other photo identification)
- reasonable supplies of all required writing materials, erasers, etc.

Materials permitted:

- a small purse or wallet, including keys, money, ID & credit cards
- one clear bottle of clear water, up to 1 litre in size (water is available at the venue)
- a closed bag stored under your seat
- any materials specified by the examiner, as set out on the front page of the exam paper

Materials not permitted, unless specified by the examiner, as set out in the front cover of the examination paper:

You **must not** bring into the examination venue any material which enables, or has the potential to enable, you or others to cheat or to gain an unfair academic advantage. Examples of materials which **are not** permitted include, but are not limited to:

- writing or other paper
- dictionaries, textbooks, notes or other reference material not specified on the front page of the exam paper
- electronic devices including: calculators, diaries, dictionaries, organisers, laptop or palmtop computers, mobile telephones, or other communication devices unless specified by the examiner (and only self-powered that operate quietly would be acceptable).
- any drinks other than clear water in a clear container

Materials NOT to be removed:

You must not remove from the venue any materials issued for use in the examination, or any copies of such materials. All such materials remain the property of the University, whether the materials were actually used or not. These includes scripts, blank answer books, question papers and drawing or scribble paper.

Bags

Students bringing **bags** into the exam venue may be subject to inspection as you enter the venue. Place all the materials you will need on your desk, close your bag and store it under your seat. Any items not permitted in the exam must be stored in your bag and not your pockets.

Mobile Phones

You are not permitted to bring your mobile phone into the exam venue unless it is switched off and stored in your closed bag under your seat.

If a mobile phone is found switched on in your possession during the exam it will be deemed as a breach of the policy and will be held as unauthorised material and returned to you at the end of the exam. This may result in the matter being referred to the Head of School for further action in accordance with the Academic Dishonesty Procedures.

Before the Primary Examination

Students with an illness and/or exceptional personal circumstances must submit their application for R/AA to their School or Faculty **no later than 3 business days** after the occurrence of the condition, illness and/or exceptional personal circumstances, which form the grounds on which their application is made, regardless of the date of the primary exam.

During the Primary Examination

Students who become ill on the way to or during the exam must notify an exam invigilator at the venue and apply for a replacement exam **within 3 business days** of the date of the primary exam.
