

The Centre's final closure date is 12/12/14.












.The café will be open daily during semester from 8:30am to 5pm.

It has been a busy and fun time for the ESIG this semester! On the 23rd of August in conjunction with PASIG, the 2014Rural Practice Day was held. The day kicked off at 9am and students rotated between 5 stations working with horses, cattle and alpacas. Students also learnt about biosecurity precautions, nerve blocks, hoof amputations, bandaging, ultrasound methods, general husbandry and much, much more!

On the 13th of September we were very lucky to be involved in another castration clinic held at the Adelaide Plains Equine Clinic, taken by the very knowledgeable Elizabeth Herbet and her fantastic team. Students enjoyed watching a demonstration, administering tetanus injections, inserting microchips as well as having a go at castrating themselves.

This year on the 14th of September we had our very first Equine Biomechanics and Muscle Day. We were very lucky to have the knowledgeable Alastair Brooks, an equine tension release therapist who flew from Melbourne spend the day just with us! Alastair has spent 70 years with horses and has extensive knowledge on their anatomy and physiology, as well as holistic approaches to medicine. Students partook in a morning session of theory and then were able to watch demonstrations and have a go to understand the benefits of this very amazing therapy approach themselves.

Our last event of the year was at Globe Derby on the 10th October 4.30pm – an evening at the trots! Students had a tour of the facilities, worked with the vets, enjoyed a meal and watched the races.

Grants

Walter Dorothy Duncan Trust, The Walter & Dorothy Duncan Trust provides financial assistance with educational costs for students who do not have sufficient funds to further their studies, including projects of merit i.e. exchange trips or to purchase necessary resources. This grant is only for continuing students who have completed at least one semester at the University of Adelaide and who have demonstrated academic merit. Grant amounts vary depending on need, and availability of funds. Please contact us as above for an appointment or further information.

Replacement Exams

A reminder to all students that if you need to apply for a replacement exam this should be done as soon as the event necessitating the replacement exam occurs.

The University policy states the following_.

As a general rule, the University does not consider minor ailments such as colds and respiratory infections as grounds for being certified unfit to sit an exam. Students are encouraged to sit the primary examination. There is no guarantee that a R/AA will be offered. Students who have a medical condition of a temporary or permanent nature may be able to complete their examination under Alternative Exam Arrangements.

Before the primary exam: Students with an illness and/or exceptional personal circumstances must submit their application for R/AA to their School or Faculty **no later than 5 business days** after the occurrence of the condition, illness and/or exceptional personal circumstances, which form the grounds on which their application is made, regardless of the date of the primary exam.

During the exam: Students with an illness and/or exceptional personal circumstances **on the day of the primary exam** must notify an exam supervisor at the venue and apply for R/AA **within 5 business days** of the date of the primary exam.

R/AA is discretionary. Students are encouraged to attend the primary exam wherever possible; as there can be no guarantee that a R/AA will be offered.
