

Student Experiences on AHEMS

When holidays rolled around, I didn't always look forward to placements as it was a loss of "holidays" and income from my part time job. However, more often than not the week (or two) flew by and before I knew it, it was Friday leaving me overwhelmed with gratitude and very hesitant to leave.

I completed my placements with 9 different species groups and at 12 sites from the Roseworthy piggery to a large feedlot in Meningie and many in between. A police clearance (less than 12 months old) is required.

Details on obtaining a police clearance are supplied by AWL to successful

- All volunteers at AWL are 18 years old or over.
- Volunteers are required to work a minimum 2-hour shift on their designated day.
- Volunteers are required to work on a roster system with regular shifts.
- Volunteers are required to enter into training programs as designated by Animal Welfare League and its Managers.
- All volunteers owned animals must be vaccinated and certification sighted by AWL.
