Don't forget the AUU is now signing up staff and students for Semester 2 gym memberships. At \$50 for the semester it's hard to find a good excuse NOT to work out!

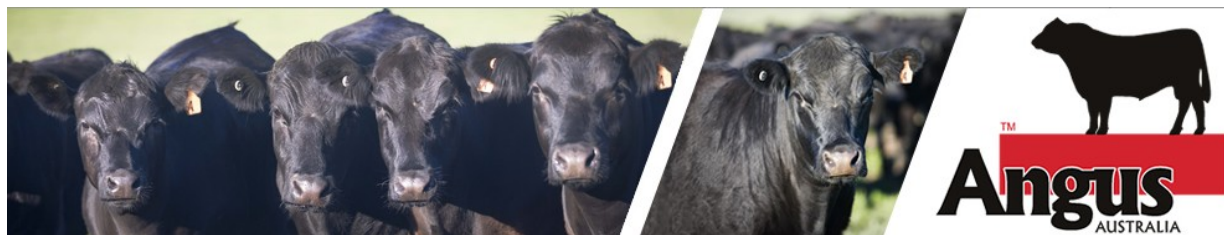
EFTPOS is also now available for all purchases over \$10.

THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN BEEF CATTLE ASSESSMENT SCHOOL

The Angus Society of Australia holds an annual Cattle Assessment School which is open to all interested cattle breeders and students. This year's school was held in Lucindale and had a focus on the selection of Females and Bulls, animal health and EBV's, genomics and genetics. The course also had a strong commercial emphasis and involved both practical assessment of various cattle breeds and classroom based training.

Five Roseworthy students, Ainslie Colbert, Caz McGrath, Brooke Crowell, Jessie Thomson and Michael Wilks attended this year's school. Topics covered included; Determine market specifications, Select stock for different markets, Determine visual and objective selection methods, Assess stock against market requirements, Establish female selection criteria and Establish bull selection criteria. It was a very educational two days and many guest speakers travelled from interstate to make presentations. Everyone in attendance was able to compete and was assessed on each section. There were around 50 competitors ranging in age and experience and Brooke Crowell was awarded a Merit for placing fourth in the competition.
