It was the State dinner held at the House of Assembly, which was attended by all State legislators and other distinguished guests, who sang rousing choruses, and joined hands with His Royal Highness to sing "Auld Lang Syne."

So obviously did the Royal guest enjoy the proceedings that he re-mained more than an hour beyond the official time set for his departure, only to find thousands of people still waiting in the wet streets to cheer him on his way back to Government House.

A memorable Royal visit will close today when His Royal Highness, at 6 p.m., will embark on the Sussex at Outer Harbor for Mel-bourne, where he will arrive on Thursday morning. His arrival will mark the beginning of Victoria's Centenary celebrations.

Before leaving he will witness, this afternoon, the school children's demonstration at the Adelaide Oval. It should be a fitting fare-well to His Royal Highness, whose pleasing personality, tact, and charm of manner have gained, to an unsurpassed extent, the goodwill of all classes.
