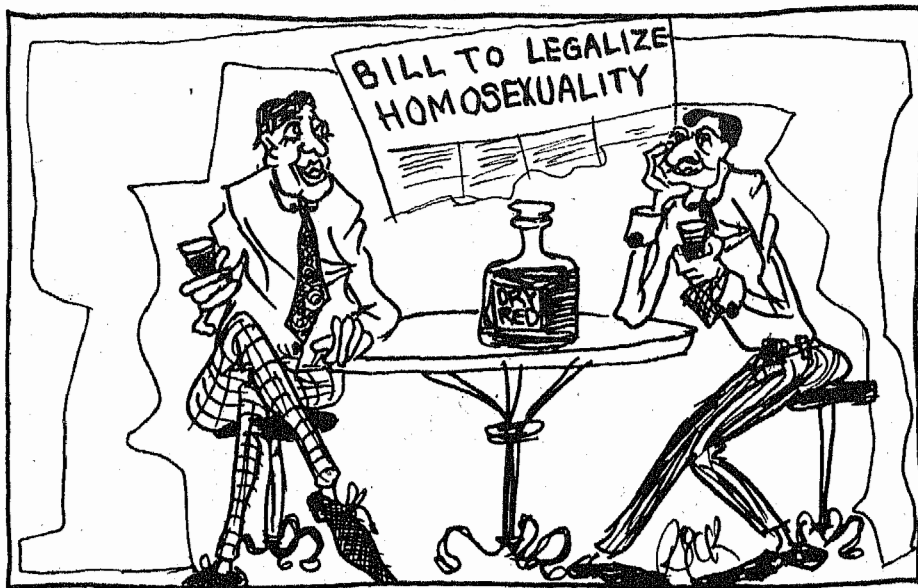

HIGH MORALE

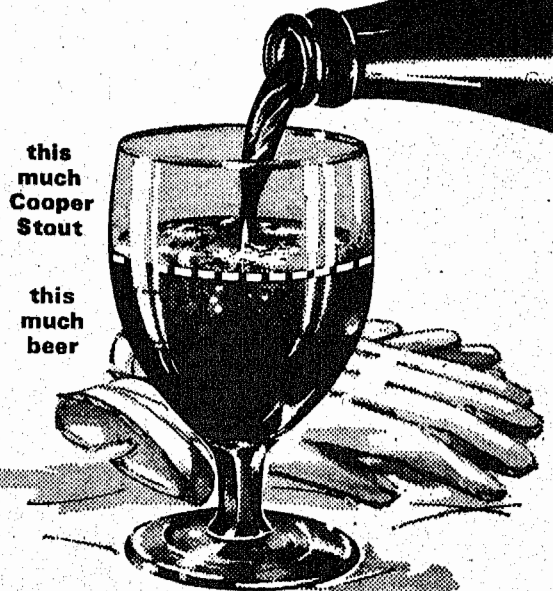
The morale of our troops is very high, though some cannot help feeling disgust and horror at the ugly war.

This brought to my mind another Biblical reference: "But I say unto you, that you resist not evil, but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also" (Math. 5:39): However the padre was quoting from the Old Testament; I'm afraid the New Testament just isn't practical; after all, war is inevitable.

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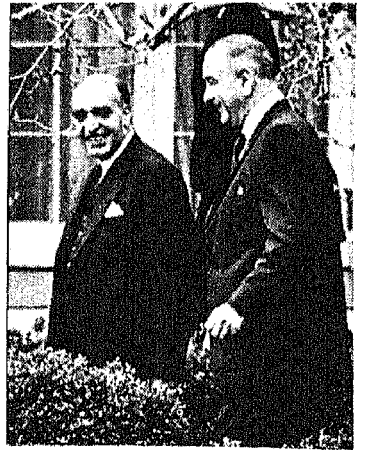
Sways World Trend His Way

WIDE SCALE FIGHTING IN CONGO

Fighting has erupted in the Congo again between rebel troops in what was formerly Katanga, and the Government in Kimhasa. Yesterday rebel troops claimed to have captured Kimhasa, and the Government troops were reported to be in control of Katanga. Rebel troops this morning recaptured Katanga but lost Kimhasa back to the Government. This afternoon rebel troops captured Kimhasa again, and the Government were in control of Katanga. The situation tonight was confused, and it is believed that contact has at last been made between the two armies, with heavy fighting between rival looting squads.

Thousands of civilians have been decapitated, raped or eaten.

The White House today is reported to be keeping a close watch on the situation to see which side China is helping, so that the U.S. can step in and support the cause of freedom and justice with the other side. At the moment the White House is in a dilemma since the Russians are helping that side already.

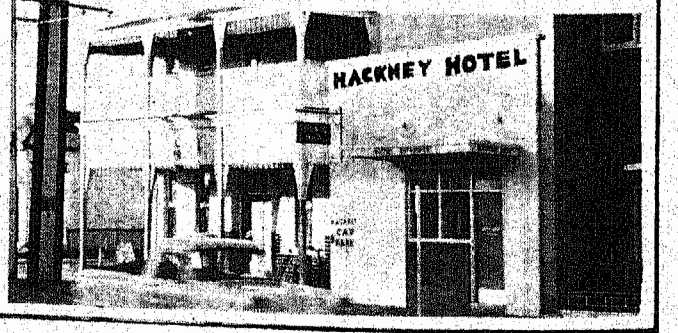

FOREIGN GOVT'S. PROTEST

The Lord Mayor of Glenelg announced plans to build a canal between Adelaide and Darwin as part of Glenelg's foreshore development project. The Federal and State Governments are interested and may be allowed to help, said the Mayor.

Since Adelaide under Mr. Dungstone's leadership is fast becoming the centre of Australia, it seems only logical to enable shipping to bypass the lesser ports of Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and Perth.

Mr. Dungstone was very enthusiastic about the Council's idea. He commented that it should be a boost to Adelaide's already thriving industry. Adelaide has close connections with Darwin, with the legal and education professions being centred there. Such a scheme would be something like having a Murrumbidgee between Adelaide and Darwin.

The problems of gouging the canal through Ayers Rock with a minimum of damage is being examined, as the Government wishes to preserve the monolith if possible.

The Chinese Government has protested strongly, saying the scheme is an Imperialist Capitalist plot by the Glenelg Council, running dogs to the USA, to drain the Yellow Sea into the Southern Ocean to make America's invasion of China easier.

Japan also protested about the dangers of large scale pollution to the sea by Adelaide water, which could wreck Japan's fishing industry.

The Periodical 50 Years Ago

Headlines in this periodical 50 years ago were —

The Council said it was aware of the difficulties but stressed the great advantages of a quick means of transport with Darwin that the canal would supply. Also, the water flowing from the Indian Ocean could be used to swell the Torrens Lake and to melt the Antarctic ice cap, enabling overseas interests to prospect their mineral leases there. However the project is unlikely to be started for some time as the Commonwealth Government will not give aid until the Ord River scheme is completed.

BANNED

The Minister Customs and Exercise today announced a ban on the further publication and sale of cook books, on the grounds that there was evidence of an increasing undue emphasis on the tempting exposition of food becoming apparent. It was a fact, he claimed, that certain people salivated whilst viewing the deliberately detailed illustrations of the preparatory acts and even dribbled at the vivid recounting of its consumption. Many such recipes sought quite blatantly to make food exciting and arousing in immature minds an avid search for satiation.

The public is assured that the censors adhered to their long-standing criteria in these matters, namely 'does this literature tend to corrupt those who tend to be corrupted?' From sample tests conducted at random among the Department's tea waitresses, it was shown that cook books do tend to provoke certain reactions in those who are provoked by cook books. Clearly the public needs protection from this. If present conditions persist the number of incidents of revolting depravity occurring will rise, things like drooling, and eating between meals will be seen everywhere. Gustation like gestation is one of those subjects which only adult people may consider.

The effect of the ban is not expected to be felt at all. It remains the duty of each State Government to enforce the ban, and should books become unobtainable in any one State, they can always be bought across the border in the others.

SOUSTRAYAN POLITICAL ROW

From our foreign correspondent

Addid, Monday — From the capital of the colonial seat, Addid, came reports today of a political row likely to upset the quiet, peace-loving citizens of Southrayid. Rumors in government circles have grown over the past week about the opposition party's electoral campaign. Reliable sources claimed today that a backbencher wants to advance an actual positive political policy, something along the lines of the present government's campaign which swung them into power.

Several members had to be assisted into the Parliament House bar when the news struck the Upper House. One member threatened to drive his Bentley into the local river in protest, but was told it was empty owing to the inclement weather.

Stiff Letter

A stiff letter of concern has been drawn up by a special committee and handed to the party leader, demanding that he continue the electoral campaign as planned. The committee's main task in recent months has been to provide handy rumor-sized information, neat statistics and slogans, all designed to show how hopeless the present government is.

A spokesman for the committee spoke with foreign correspondents today, and said that, until this bombshell, everything had been going well. "We're not going to see hours of work wasted by some fool standing up and saying what we will do if we get in power again," he said. "That suggestion is not only ridiculous, it is impossible, because we don't know what we would do."

The local press have taken a dim view of the new "positive policy" idea. One paper suggested it would upset the whole political system by having both parties thinking constructively, and predicted a revolt by the hillside villagers if the plan was continued. The other paper left it to its brilliant young cartoonist, already

Egypt May Have Invaded N.T.

There is as yet no confirmation of rumors, backed by claims on Cairo radio, that Egypt invaded and captured the NT four weeks ago.

In Canberra Prime Minister Bolt said if Egypt had invaded he was most perturbed at this blatant act of aggression, but added that it would save paying refugee's passages. Reports that Anthony Eden was called in to mediate in any dispute were denied.

Troop Movements

When questioned about Aust. troop movements Mr. Bolt ineptly tried to sidestep the questions and meandered on to say that one division was sent there on a survival exercise in 1952 and since nothing has ever been heard from them, he supposed they were still there.

Cairo Claims Victory

Meanwhile in Cairo, Col. Nasser praised his troops for their outstanding bravery. He said the NT was chosen for its climate, its freedom from Jews, a ready-made camel population and Ayers rock, which hollowed out would make a tomb fitting for the great leader that he is. Col. Nasser went on to say that further plans envisaged an invasion of Kangaroo Island sometime in 10-15 years.

Watch for further up-to-date reports as to whether the rumor is true.

AMERICA'S CUP SCANDAL

Newport, Rhode Island — Australia's American Cup challenger, Dame Patty, was involved in a disastrous collision with a dinghy off Rhode Island last night.

Dame Patty was not badly injured in the collision but the paintwork was slightly scratched, which may affect her chances in the Cup. It was understood that Mr. Ming was personally distressed about the dinghy running up Dame Patty's stern, and was relieved to hear there was no structural damage.

In The House

In the House of Representatives today, new member Mr. St. Luke, questioned the government's handling of the whole affair in a brilliant speech. He called for a Royal Commission to examine allegations that the crew of the Dame Patty were drunk, and that Captain Jock Strap was a famous alcoholic. Mr. Chaney,

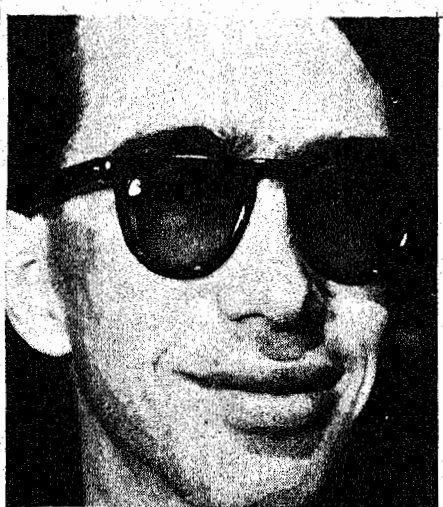
Minister for the Navy, denied responsibility for the Dame Patty and discounted rumors that she had been made flagship of the Australian Navy.

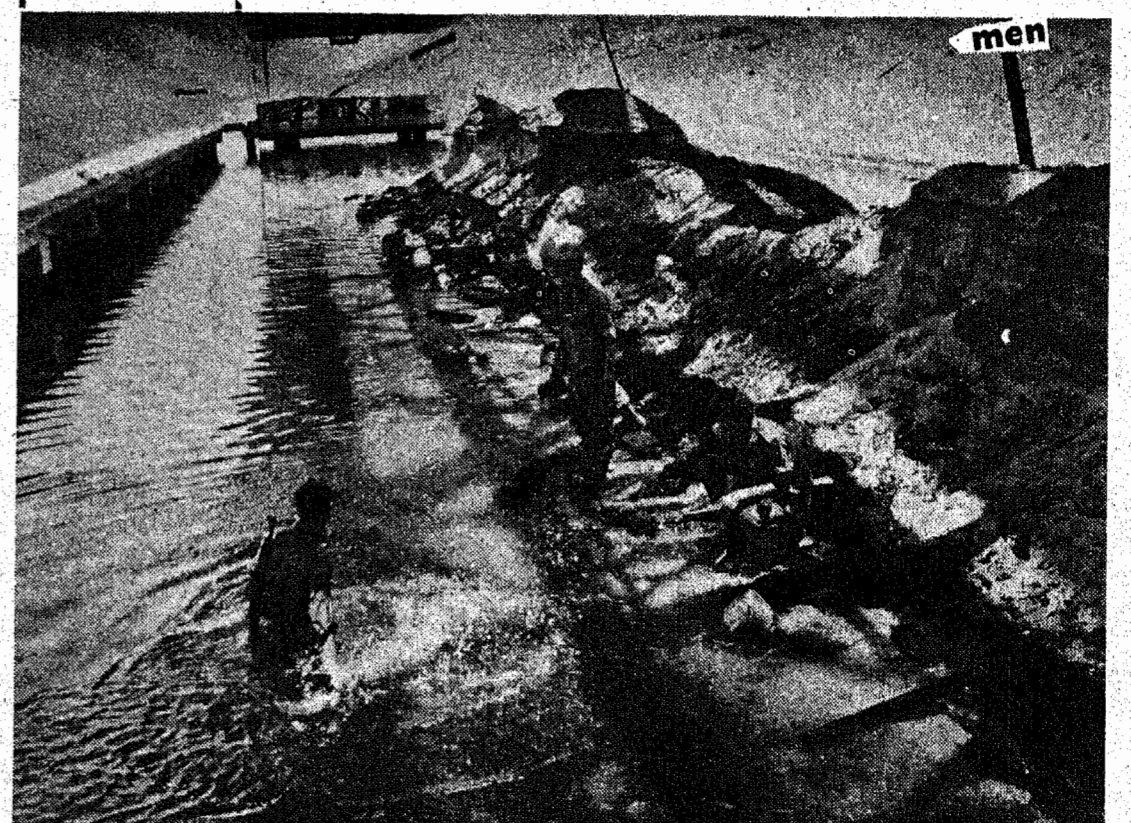

The State Of The Economy

ADVERTISER TAKE OVER

Mr. McMahon announced yesterday that the government was very pleased with the state of the economy. He held great hopes for a steady growth far into the future. The government was particularly pleased with the breakdown of the price-wage spiral, wages being held static with the co-operation of the Arbitration Commission. However, some concern is still held for the rising prices.

Mr. McMahon said he was particularly pleased with the advances by the SA economy, and even more cuts in the Federal Government expenditure should ensure that Mr. Dungstones would not be present at the next meeting of the Loan Council Club.

Mr. McMahon said that the next budget would embody an increase in Parliamentary salaries to provide a boost to consumptive expenditure. 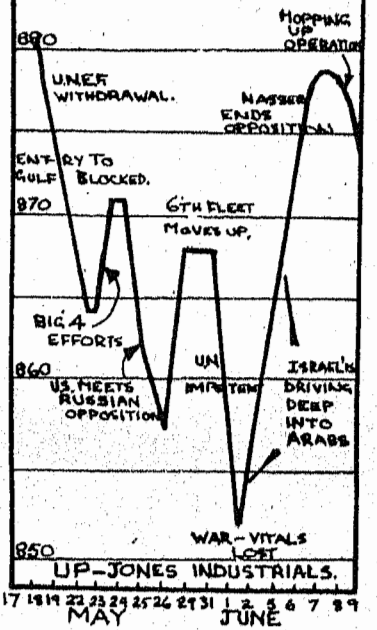

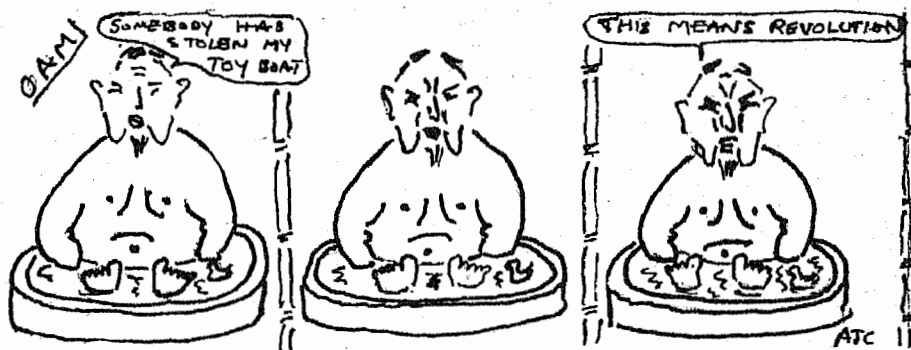

'A TRIP ON THE BUS BETWEEN 29 WIMPOLE STREET AND MY PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT, 29 WIMPOLE STREET BEING MY PLACE OF ABODE' is another masterpiece by the leading modern writer I.M. Anonymous. I.M. has mastered his: existentialist, surrealist, phsychedelic style and this hard hitting book must mark a place for him (or her) as one of the greatest writers of our time.

Further reviews are unavailable as our reviewer has unfortunately disappeared in the arms of one of those rare creatures, a zealous dust bin collector.

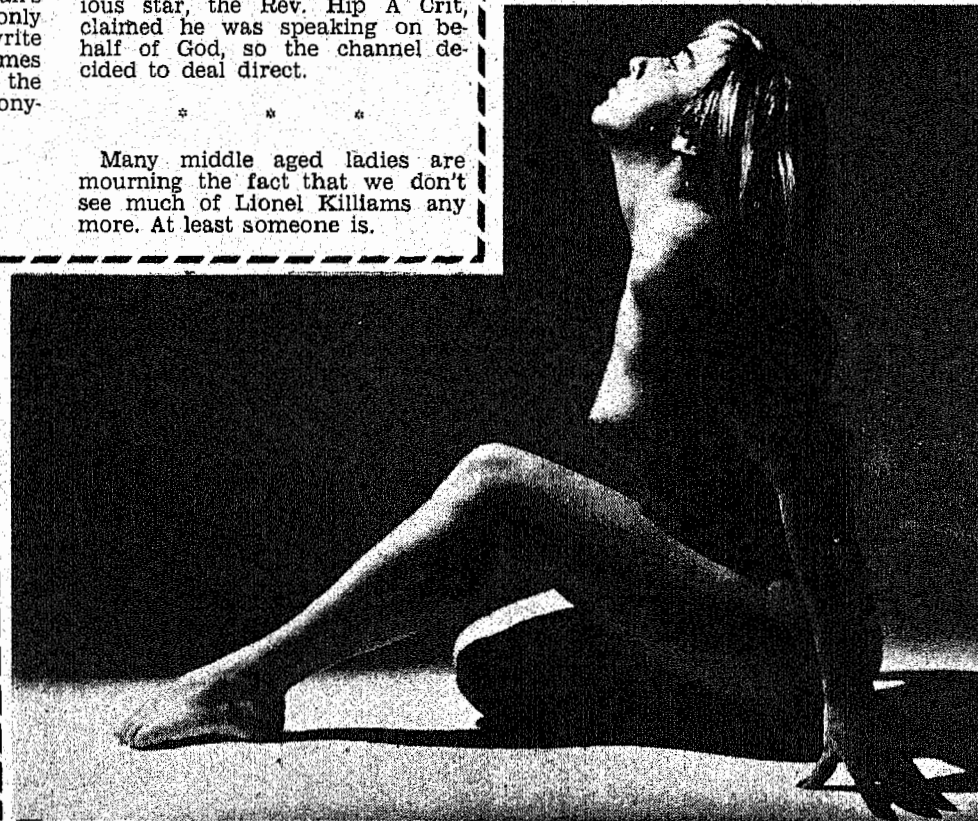

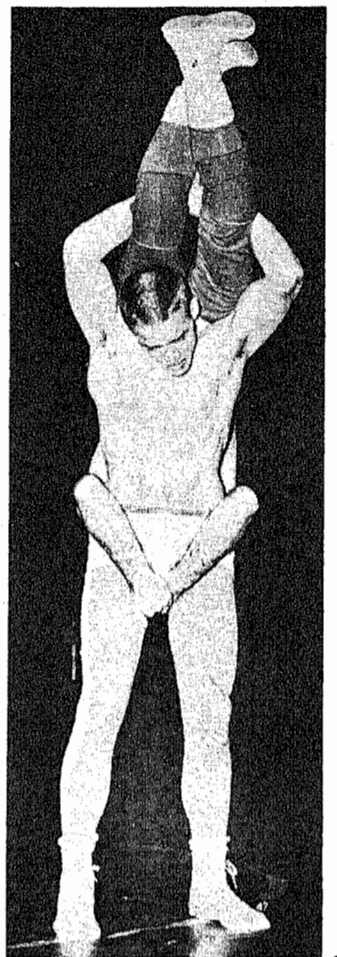

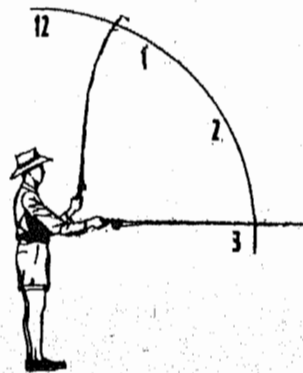

With Rod And Sinker

ONE HANDED CASTING



ONE HAND CASTING

This advanced skill requires much experience and practice. The placing of your rod accurately is difficult enough with two hands but prolonged practice is the answer to frustrated anglers in desperate need of a new entry.

BEGINNER'S ANGLE

- Correct use of your rod:
- As a means of placing the bait accurately (and periodically);
 - to keep your ball in place while angling;
 - to give earlier and easier detection of the bite;
 - as a shock absorber to lunges and struggle;
 - to help avoid breakages even on full stretch.

And remember, if your rod does not bend at least 90 deg. at the tip in use, you are not getting the best from it.

ADVANCED TACTICS

To give added attraction as you pull your fly, move your rod up and down and from side to side with jerky movements. This conveys the tantalising impression that the fly is alive when really it is your rod waiting to pounce.

Word of advice from one who had fresh angles on this sport — "come ye after me and I will make you to become fishers of men", St. Mark 1:17.

Gear boxes

(The technique of driving in your hot rod to achieve satisfaction).

This article as you know deals with both old and new vehicles and how to get the best ride out of them.

Nowadays sporty models seem to go for a stubby lever with a largish knob. The style in this case is to have a bit of a stab at the throttle, clutch once, then slip the lever up and down smoothly. This type of box is well constructed and has been known to last an incredibly long distance giving trouble free operation.

The old timers had a long thin lever often bent in the middle either through design or too vigorous use. The boxes were known as crash boxes. The technique was to clutch twice vigorously, then you felt round for a while, grabbed your knob and smashed it in. A really wild grind was always the result.

In either case after a lot of practice you will find your movements will become smooth and satisfying. There is nothing like a bad grind, but as some consolation to the learners we all seem to have one periodically.

A word of warning to used vehicle buyers. Big dealers often stuff the boxes with various materials. This of course keeps the grinding down to a minimum and when you pay for one you find it very difficult to move your knob up and down. If you ever get caught then remove the cover and extract the material. After inspecting the damage you can either make do with a sloppy box or ask for your money back.

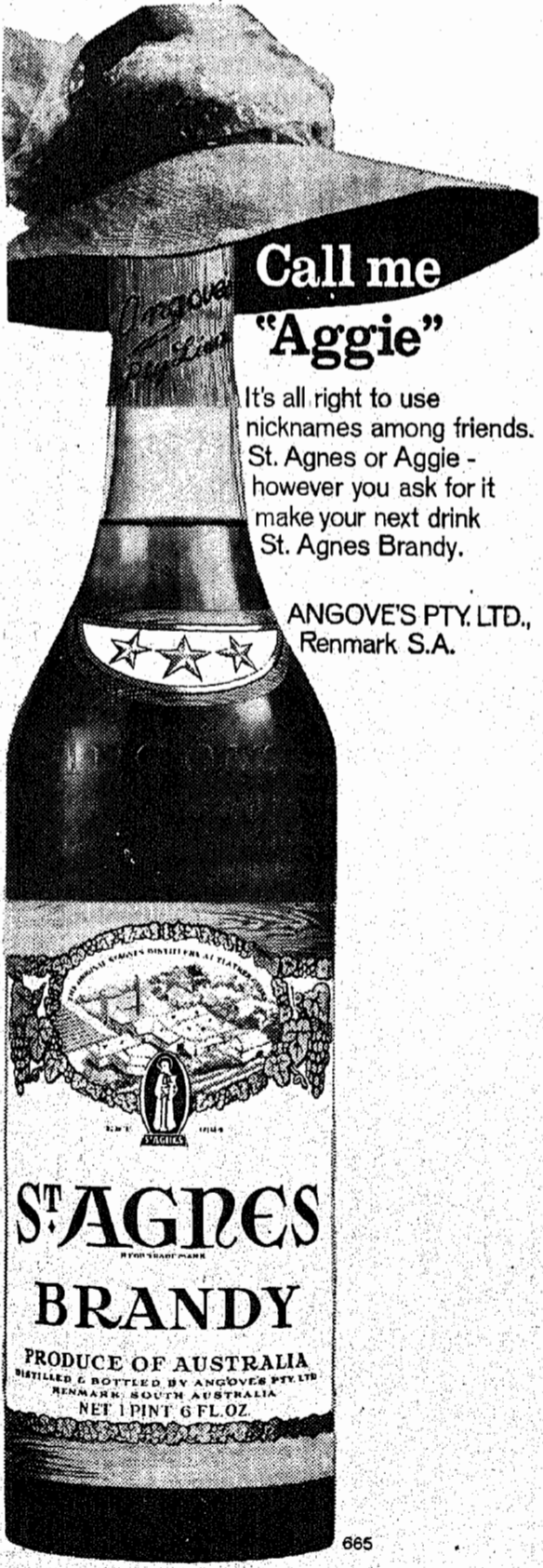
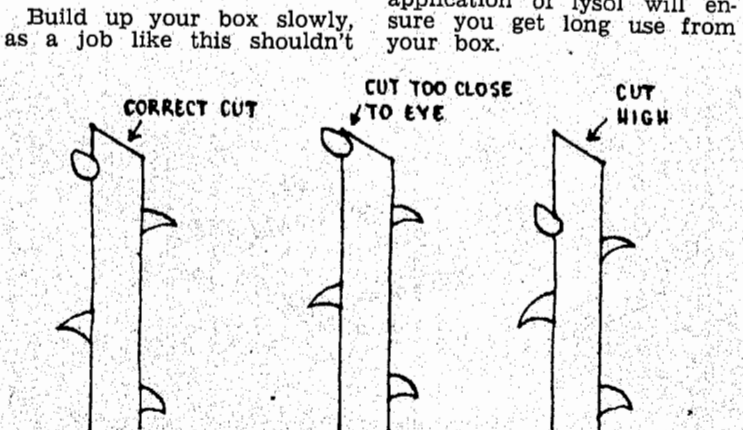
HANDYMAN

OK handy men, take up your tools and get to work. Today we're going to make a flower box. An attractive box of this sort is ideal for indoor displays, but can be used outside. Measurements shown are for a 12" x 15" x 6" size box, but can be altered to suit your own requirements. Get your planks sawn to the right size (about 6"), run a spokeshave over it a few times to smooth it off, being careful not to cut yourself, as a spokeshave can give a very nasty injury (see diagram).

be hurried. It's sometimes a good idea to rub linseed oil into your plank at this stage, to soften it and make it long lasting.

The legs to the box should be spaced well apart to give firm support. When putting together joints must be driven in hard, and a long screw in every joint is a must.

As a final word of advice, a good box must be carefully maintained, otherwise it will harden and crack on you. Regular use will ensure that natural oils are brought to the surface, and a periodic application of lysol will ensure you get long use from your box.





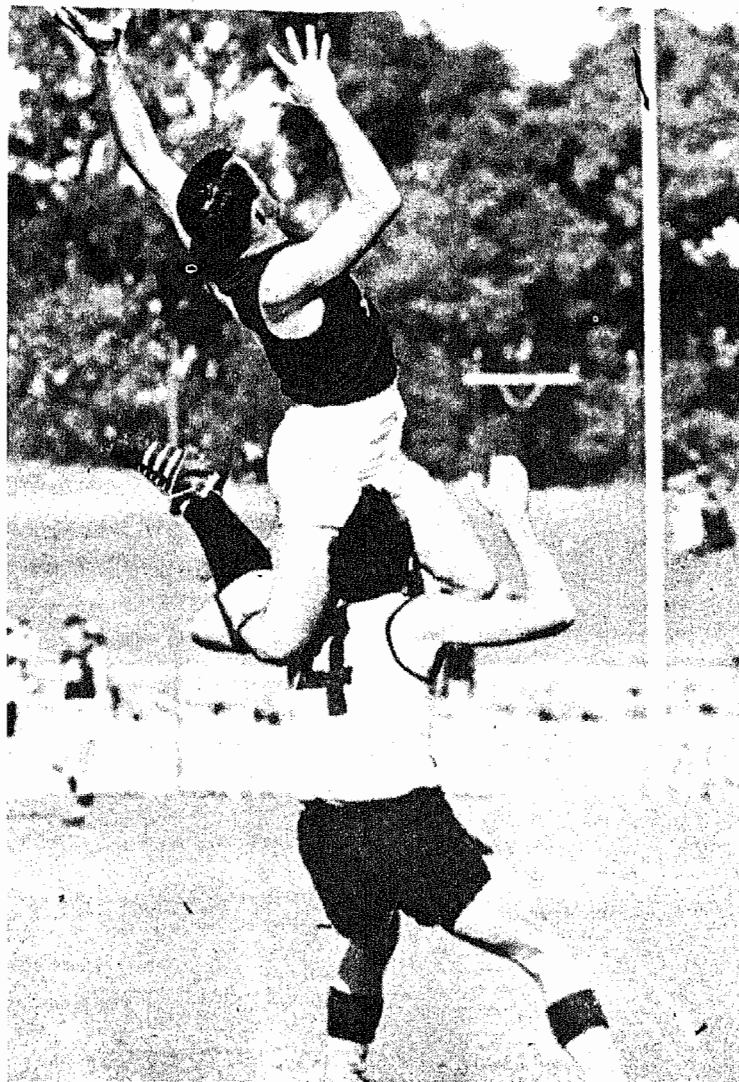

REDLEGSIES SIGN SUGG

Central Districts great win over Woodville at Woodville Oval two years ago strongly suggest they may be in the running for a berth in the final four in 1968. Intense interest has been aroused by the fight for next year's four. As yet no teams have opened up a big lead, but it is expected that by this time next year the position should be somewhat clearer.

Football experts are predicting that four teams will play off in the finals next year — which would be the same number as last year. The battle for a place in the finals next year will be particularly keen, as this may possibly be the fifth to last round of finals played at Adelaide Oval. The rumor which I started in this column last week, that the SANFL might move its headquarters to Elizabeth Oval, has now got back to me from five different sources — which leads me to believe it may be true.

As the 1967 season moves into its final half, interest is shifting to next year, and future years. It is reported that Norwoodies has signed a brilliant new recruit from the Birdsville Track. He is 67-year-old Bert Sugg, who was born and bred only 280 miles from Port Wakefield, where SA's Mr. Football, Fos Williams, once stopped off to go to the toilet.

Recruit Sugg was first noticed shoeing a horse behind the Marree pub, and Norwoodies' local talent scout Fred "007" Shepherd immediately signed him up as a sprigger for Norwoodies Colts. Norwoodies are expecting big things from this lad, but will have a hard fight to get him a transfer from the local Marree Mashers. Norwoodies are reported to have talked in 3-figure sums — but the Mashers reply so far has been in 4-letter words.

Hottest news in the South Australian camp comes from the Queen Victoria Maternity Hospital, where another in the long line of brilliant footballers in the Papadimitropoulos family has just come into the world. Mrs. Papadimitropoulos predicts a big future for the young Papadimitropoulos — she could feel him practising left-foot dropkicks in the womb.

The lad's father, former South door-keeper, Dimitri Papadimitropoulos, also predicts a big future for the lad, though he does not feel his son is forward enough in his preparation to be considered a likely major force in South's bid for premiership honors next year. Dimitri's football background got the better of him at the birth, and his first words to his son were "Open ya eyes, ya mug".

Trouble is brewing in the Sturties camp — coach Jack Oatey has just signed a two-year coaching contract with the club. Legal advice has been taken, because of doubts about the meaning of the contract, and this has led to the belief that the contract will expire after two years. This means that after two years, either:

Oatey will have to sign a new contract with the club
or — he will no longer be coach.

The latter possibility may well upset the Sturties team in 1968, since they will be playing in the knowledge that their coach may be leaving soon. Neil Kerley is rumored to be interested in taking over from Oatey.

Further potential problems in the Sturties camp stem from the calculation of well-known part time statistician, Claude Norks, that if the Double Blues field the same team as this year, they will have an average age next year of 12.00 months greater than at present. Advancing years may well have a slowing effect on the Blues — but then again they may compensate for this with greater experience. Which effect will predominate is in my book problematical, and only time will tell, but it can be said with certainty that it might well have an important bearing on the final four.

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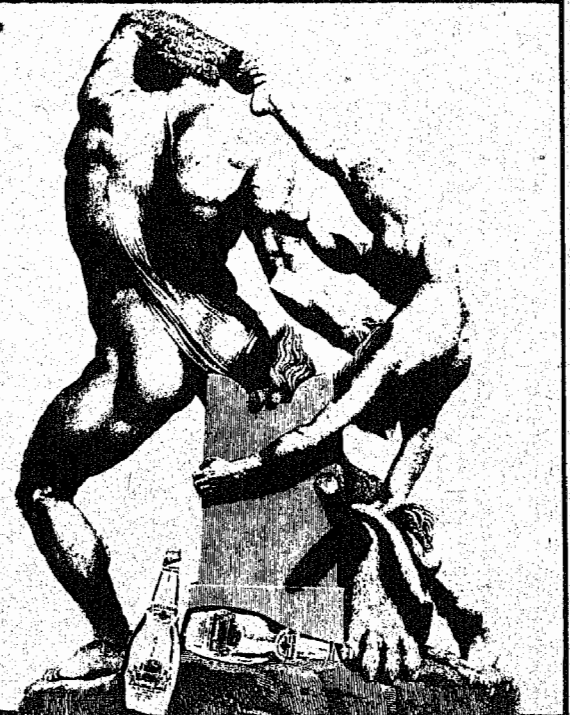
