THE UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS.

The University examinations are over, and the candidates know their fate. For the Junior, 28 girls (of whom one was absent) and 79 boys sent in their names; 3 girls and 23 boys failed. A noticeable feature in the list is the high places of the representatives of the gentler sex. They are *facile princeps*, and the boys are nowhere conspicuous except in the third class, where they have little feminine company. It will be remembered that for the Matriculation examination out of 59 who presented themselves 40 were successful in passing. Taking the numbers for both examinations together we find that 32 out of 36 girls and 88 out of 129 boys passed, thus leaving 4 girls and 41 boys unsuccessful. This is proof positive of one thing, and that is that the managers of the ladies' schools in the colony are quite as capable of preparing students for the Junior and Matriculation Examinations as the managers of boys' schools. We are not concerned at present to enquire whether this is an advantage or not, but, taking examinations for the moment as a criterion of work, it must be acknowledged that the girls' schools have a marked advantage.
