

TAXATION BILL.

Adjourned debate on second reading. The Hon. G. BROOKMAN said it was a matter of regret that increased taxation was necessary. The statement made by the Commissioner of Public Works that the Government had cut down expenses in all directions was quite correct; and it was to be commended for the endeavour to make the public accounts balance, also for giving a straightforward account of the finances of the State.
