

and informing him that Professor Ives quite agreed to this course. In the event of Mr. Wale consenting, it was resolved to send the papers to Professor Peterson and ask him to supply the council with a report thereon. On December 5 Mr. Wale telegraphed as follows:—'Have no objection whatever, provided it be distinctly set forth that passing papers practically means a degree in music.' This telegram was not received early enough to allow of the papers being dispatched to Melbourne that day. Professor Ives came into the office, and I informed him that Mr. Wale had agreed to the papers being submitted to Professor

Peterson. He then handed me the candidates' papers, and requested that before they were dispatched to Professor Peterson all the annotations pencilled on them by Mr. Wale should be rubbed out. Although this request was made I had no power to act upon it without being authorized to do so on behalf of the council. Next morning, December 6, I wrote to Professor Peterson informing him of the divergence of opinion between the examiners, and asking him to look over the papers, and report thereon to the council. With the letter I forwarded the candidates' papers and the under-mentioned documents:—(a) Copies of the questions on harmony and form and instrumentation papers; (b) copy of the minutes of the education committee; (c) copy of Mr. Wale's report; (d) copies of Mr. Wale's marking sheets; (e) copies of Mr. Ives's marking sheets; (f) copy of Professor Ives's letter as to the divergence of opinion between the examiners; (g) copy of the letter written to Mr. Wale, by direction of the council, asking if he would agree to the papers being submitted to Professor Peterson; (h) copy of telegram from Mr. Wale received in reply to the above-mentioned letter; (i) copy of the regulations of the degree of Bachelor of Music. When preparing the papers for dispatch to Professor Peterson the chancellor happened to come into the office, and I informed him of Professor Ives's request. The chancellor directed that I was not to erase the annotations made by Mr. Wale, as neither he nor I had any right to alter any of the documents; and further, the education committee intended that all the documents should be submitted unaltered to Professor Peterson. This view was confirmed by the council at their meeting on Friday last. At the meeting of the education committee Professor Ives did not express a wish to send any further report than was contained in his marking sheets and the minutes of the committee, but on Friday morning, the 6th inst., when I was preparing the papers for dispatch to Mr. Wale, the chancellor told me to ascertain if Professor Ives would like to send any report to Professor Peterson. I could not find Professor Ives, and had no communication with him until Saturday morning, the 7th inst., when he telephoned that he had only just received my message. I then asked whether he wished to send any report to Professor Peterson, and told him that all the data had been sent to Professor Peterson by Friday's mail, and that if he desired to supplement what had been forwarded by a report I would telegraph to Professor Peterson stating that it would be posted that day. He asked if I had rubbed out the marks, and on my telling him that I had sent all the documents unaltered Professor Ives declined to send any report. He afterwards gave me a copy of the following telegram which he said he had sent to Professor Peterson:—'Don't open papers. My consent withdrawn because of certain improper action.'

Sir—Mr. Homburg in his speech in the House of Assembly on Wednesday presumes that numbers only are given by candidates on their examination papers. This, however, is not the case. On the papers in question names of candidates were given, not numbers, and this is the usual practice. Regarding the statements made by Professor Ives against the Chancellor of the University, I trust the whole incident may be the subject of a searching enquiry. The wrongdoer should suffer—Professor Ives if his charge is unfounded; the Chancellor if it is based on facts.—I am, &c.,

MUS. BAC. EXAMINATION.

To the Editor.

Sir—The statements appearing in your columns re the above examinations must indeed be an eye opener to those of the public who take an interest in the affairs of our educational institutions. What are we to understand? Is it possible that Mr. Wale (who, by the way, was a candidate for the chair of music), when he set question 4 of the harmony paper, expected the students to complete the same? If he did, then, in view of the expressed opinion of such musical authorities as Professor Ives (the other examiner) Professor Peterson (the referee), and Mr. Harold Davies, Mus. Bac., of this city, that the question is absurd, and ought never to have been set, he (Mr. Wale) ought to be removed from his position as co-examiner, on account of his failure to understand the requirements of the examination. It is not the possible injury Professor Ives may suffer that has induced me to write, but to call attention to the great injustice the students are groaning under. Here is an examination paper, consisting of seven questions, one of which (No. 4) musical authorities, including Professor Ives and Mr. Davies, say it would take from four to six hours to complete, and this paper is placed before these students, and they are allowed three hours in which to complete the whole seven questions! The idea is preposterous, and I am positively shocked at the action of the council in upholding Mr. Wale's decision against such overwhelming evidence that the question in the time was an impossibility. I trust the council will review their decision, and allow the candidates another exam., and thereby remove an injustice from, to use Professor Ives's words, "the best set of students who have ever entered the Adelaide University for the degree of Mus. Bac."—I am, &c.,
