Mr. Kidston stated that he had received apologies for absence from the Chancellors of the Universities of Melbourne and Adelaide. The kindly and friendly way in which the sister universities had received the advent of the younger sister university was one of the most pleasing features of the celebration, and in this connection he noted with appreciation the attendance of Professors David and Stirling, of Sydney and Adelaide Universities respectively.

Professor David, of Sydney, had a hearty reception. He thought the university was being established under very happy auspices, by a man of the learning and culture of His Excellency, in a building with fine memories of the past, and in the presence of representatives of the Government, who had shown a desire to make the university a people's university. The Premier he commended for the idea to make the university an institution for Queensland, and not for Brisbane, and also the idea of associating it with a central technical college. He pointed to the influence of a university in keeping the community abreast of the arts of war, but hoped this institution would tend to keep them foremost in the bonds of peace. On behalf of Sydney University he conveyed to the sister university of Queensland on this historic occasion a message of goodwill and a message of god-speed.

Professor E. C. Stirling, C.M.G., who also had a hearty reception, expressed thanks on behalf of Adelaide University for the invitation conveyed and the regret of the Chancellor (Sir Samuel Way) that his judicial duties prevented him from being present. He offered congratulations to Queensland on the placing of the keystone on the educational system. It would be interesting to see whether the university in Queensland, founded by a far-seeing Government, and supported by the public, would escape the criticisms, sometimes quite undeserved, which had been directed against other universities. He hoped that a well-founded and well-equipped university might be one of the best assets, material as well as intellectual, that could be possessed by any State or nation.

Lady MacGregor then planted a tree in commemoration of the event, and the ceremony closed.
