#### A GRANT FOR EDUCATION.

The Estimates passed by Parliament last session included an amount of £1,000 in connection with the appointment of a lecturer in economics at the University of Adelaide, and £300 in connection with the Workers' Educational Association. The Premier (Hon. C. Vaughan) stated on Wednesday that the Government would advance one-fourth of the sums mentioned to provide for the last quarter of the present financial year, March to June. That would enable a start to be made at the earliest possible date. After June next the grant for the two purposes would be continued regularly in sums of £1,000 and £300 a year.

#### WORKERS' EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATION.

The Minister of Education has granted approval for representatives of the Workers' Educational Association to enter into negotiations with officials of the Education Department, in order to obtain their services as leaders of study groups, and also to make arrangements with the Director of Education for the use of school buildings during the evenings for classes. Mr. Herbert Deaton, M.A., the newly-appointed lecturer in economics at the University, and director of tutorial classes, will arrive in Adelaide about the middle of March. It will be the work of the general secretary of the association (Mr. V. E. Cromer) to organise classes, and of the tutor to arrange for instruction. The tutorial classes will be governed by a joint committee. To have the use of school buildings in all parts of the State, and the assistance of teachers, will be a great advantage to the association.

### THE MILITARY CROSS

Capt. Gordon Campbell, M.C. of the 10th Battalion, is a son of the late Dr. Allan Campbell. Before the war he was a well-known Adelaide lawyer and cricketer. He played at various times for the University, Sturt, and Adelaide clubs, and rapidly proved a wicket keeper of exceptional merit. He

was chosen in that capacity to accompany Mayne's team, which visited America in 1913, and before he returned to Australia he spent several months in England. He was appointed manager of the Eleven which was being chosen to visit South Africa in 1914, but owing to the outbreak of war the arrangements for that tour were cancelled. He has frequently been mentioned by returned officers for his courage and gallantry.

### THE MILITARY CROSS

Surgeon-Capt. David MacDonald Steele, who left South Australia with the Army Medical Corps, has been awarded the Military Cross for his work in attending the wounded. The official notification states that he attended wounded under heavy fire and trying conditions with great courage and determination. It was due to his organization and skill that they were



successfully evacuated from the position. Capt. Steele left Australia on October 9, 1915, and proceeded to the 1st Australian General Hospital at Behopolis. Later, at his own request, he was appointed Regimental Medical Officer to the 16th Battalion, and was shortly afterwards transferred to France. He is a son of Mr. S. Steele, of Jellicott street, North Adelaide.
