A Noble Career.

Admitted to the Bar.


On March 22, 1861, he was admitted to the bar, and two years later on the death of Mr. Atkinson became the sole proprietor of that gentleman's business.

Interest in Education. For years before he became Chief Justice, Mr. Way had taken an active interest in public education. In 1872 he joined the University Association, formed to take advantage of the magnificent offer of £20,000 made by Sir Walter Wake-Hobson...

On the following day he sat in the Full Court, and again on the Saturday morning. His public career was thus brought to a close. He had used up the last ounce of his strength, but he had achieved the final object of his ambition—to lay down his life in the service of his country.

Great Intellectual Power. This brief outline of Sir Samuel Way's career had taken him some time to draw, but on an occasion like that, when his memory is so fresh, it is not possible to do more than sketch the outline of his life.

High Honors Conferred. Honors flowed in upon Mr. Way, both at home and abroad. In 1891 he received the honorary degree of D.C.L. from the University of Oxford, in the company of Earl Haileybury, Lord High Chancellor of England...
