At the request of The Register's representative, Professor Darnley Naylor gave a short, farewell message for the people of the State.

"We have in Australia," he said, "a race of men and women physically magnificent, in character genial and courageous, in intellect alert and keen. But we have still to learn that thrift is a virtue, and that the arts are of higher value than games of skill and even games of chance.

"Our isolation is a grave danger, and so, in more than one sense, is our White Australia policy. The administration of Papua is admirable, and reacts for good on ourselves. When we can say the same of administration in New Guinca. lovers of Australia will give a sigh of relief.

"If our rich men encourage painting, sculpture, and art in general, as they have encouraged Universities, our claim to nationhood will begin to have a real meaning. But mere seeking after second-rate pleasures will never raise us to the first rank among the nations of the world.
