THE UNIVERSITY PROCESSION. From "SIXTH YEAR STUDENT":—In a recent issue of "The Advertiser" a correspondent wondered if the University were becoming merely a cramming establishment. He was writing with respect to what used to be an annual institution, and seems now to be dying out, the University procession. Just as in everything else, the "good old days" are a thing of the past at the University, and perhaps in some matters it is well. Hooliganism, which never became very rife at Adelaide, is now practically absent; "initiation" ceremonies are less wild, but at the same time the students seem to be less than ever a corporate body. The lack of unity among undergraduates is an evergreen subject for editors of "the Mag," and our other leaders to rant upon. Although there are other causes, such as the questioning of the wisdom of such a procedure, this is probably the principal reason for our diminishing University processions. Even in my own time I have seen a few good ones (we all know they could have been improved by cutting out vulgarity), and one got a sense of the solidarity of the student body by the numbers wearing the old "straw decker" with the well-known chequered band. The wearing of the band has been discontinued, and it would be good if it could be revived, for it had a certain effect in holding students together on special occasions such as sports, regattas, "rags," and processions. The first point raised against this is that the "straw decker" is very little worn now, but surely a body of 300 men wearing it would create a fashion. We have followed Melbourne and Sydney, where such a headgear cannot be worn because of the changeable weather, although "inter-State" men used to admire our neat hatbands. May the time soon come when the custom will be revived. In answer to the previous correspondent, a notice has been posted in the men students' unionroom intimating that the procession will be held on Thursday afternoon next, and the rest depends on how the undergrads roll up in response to this notice. Instead of being a mere advertisement for the commemoration concert, let it be an overflowing of student joy and clean fun, without the objectionable "flour-throwing," etc., which has been indulged in on occasions.

NEWS 15.12.26 DR. H. L. BROSE LEAVING Distinguished Scientist

Dr. H. L. Brose, who for the past few months has been lecturing on modern physics and examining students for the science degree at Sydney University, has been spending a few days in Adelaide prior to his return to Britain on Friday. Dr. Brose was a student at Prince Alfred College and has proved one of the most brilliant collegians from both scholastic

and sports points of view. He secured a Rhodes Scholarship while in this State and for the past seven years has been lecturer on physics at Oxford University. On his return to England he will take charge of the entire research work in connection with physics at University College, Nottingham, which is affiliated with the London University. New and extensive laboratories have recently been constructed at the University College at Nottingham as a result of a bequest of £300,000 made by Sir Jesse Booth. While in England Dr. Brose wrote and translated a number of books dealing with relativity and subjects of a similar nature. His "Theory of Relativity," with an introduction by Lord Haldane, was described by Prof. Richardson, of the London University, as "The Bible of the Twentieth Century."
