Dear Darlington,

I enclose a paper essentially Ford's, to which I have contributed some statistical discussion, and to which he has insisted on adding my name, on his work with the Meadow Brown on one of the Scilly Isles. He expresses some doubt as to whether we should regard it as sufficiently genetical for publication in Heredity, but would be very pleased if we thought it suitable.

So far as I can be impartial, I think it is worth while to publish examples of attempts to overcome the difficulties of studying wild populations, because the same difficulties arise in directly genetic studies. However, perhaps you will consider it more particularly in relation to space and time.
