Dear Professor Demois,

I am sending with this the typescript in English of the material I propose for lectures on Fiducial Inference. I may have to take fewer particular examples than are given here when it comes actually to allocating time during the lectures, for it would be a mistake to hurry in the presentation of material, the value of which lies chiefly in stimulating reflection on fundamental issues.

Have you and Frechet at all considered yet, in view of the new parity of our respective currencies, the financing of the trip you have kindly proposed? I presume that I shall be paying the fare from London and living expenses while in France and that it would be optimistic to think that this can be done with less than the equivalent of £35 of English money. Probably you can make a better estimate, but I should like to be clear that someone responsible at your end has

looked into the matter and satisfied themselves that I should be able to cover my expenses.

I hope you will find the typescript clear and intelligible.
