Dear Dr. Taylor,

As you so very kindly forwarded to us a few weeks ago a consignment of live mice from Dr. Snell of the Roscoe B. Jackson Memorial Laboratory, we are taking the liberty of consigning to you five crates of live mice from this country to Dr. Snell.

After consultation with the Rockefeller Foundation London office, we sent a cable on 1st. May to Weaver, Rockfound, New York, advising that these crates are travelling on S.S. Queen Mary, leaving

Southampton on Saturday, 4th. May. The crates have been addressed to yourself and also labelled for transmission to Dr. Small, Roscoe B. Jackson Memorial Laboratory, Bar Harbor, Maine, U.S.A.

We are sorry to be sending you these mice at such short notice, but have only just been informed that they could be sent on 4th. May. We hope that you will let us know the charges which may be incurred in dollar currency.
