Keechipup. Named on account of its being a good spearwood thicket called woorie mongron, the best sort of spearwood.

Quindelariup " " having several clear hills.

Yelgecup " " " " favourite place for kangaroos to lie down.

Knulitup " " being a very rocky place.

Cockelup " " native having got burnt there.

Coolitullup " " being infested with kangaroo ticks.

Carbinup. A fresh water swamp named on account of having plenty of turtles in it.

Paraducup. Named on account of being a good place to get wilgey.

Pendicup " " " " " " " for the red flowers

Goblebackinglup. Name given to creek which runs at the foot of Mount Barker Hill (the belly of the hill).

Bockenearup. Named on account of being a good place for water.

Booriboonup " " " a large hill

Yerreminup " " a large ironstone hill being there.

Ongerup " " having running water.

Cirnejup. The name given to a salt lake because it's covered with large rushes.

Yeulup. A place where kangaroos lay about in the dust.

Boyup. Name given on account of having a smoky appearance.

Camphallup. Name given to a big pool of water not running.

Neibechup. Name given to a creek because it contained a quantity of fresh water fish called coblers.

Legerup. A place where kangaroos are supposed to have been dancing in the early days.

Quameup. A salt lake with a clear patch of water in the centre, surrounded with rushes and was at one time a favourite place for swans.
