UNIVERSITY GRADUATES

LUNCHEON TO NEW MEMBERS

Waite Institute Praised

Under the spreading plane trees in Botanic Park this afternoon the Graduates' Association of the University of Adelaide entertained new graduates at luncheon.

In the absence of Mr. E. W. Holden (president), who was detained in Melbourne, Prof. A. L. Campbell (vice-president) occupied the chair. Associated with him at the head table were the Hon. M. McIntosh (Minister of Education), Dr. A. W. Hill (director of Kew Gardens), London, Drs. R. H. Palleine, and Florence McCoy Hill, Prof. R. W. Chapman, H. H. Woollard, and C. S. Hicks, and Messrs. W. G. T. Goodman (general manager of the Municipal Tramways Trust), and W. Fuller, who has resigned as lecturer in histology at the University.

Mr. McIntosh congratulated the graduates on their success. Those who had not attained to the heights of their ambition he reminded that there was still plenty of room for expansion.

High Traditions

The Education Department was proud of the University, to which the young State could point with a great deal of pride. He hoped present-day graduates would keep up those high traditions as exemplified by those who had gone before them. Money spent on the University, he said, was a gilt-edged investment.

Replies were made by Mr. A. H. Lendon, who had obtained first honors in medicine, and Miss M. M. Frost (first honors in English). They thanked the association for its hearty welcome.

Prof. Woollard, speaking on behalf of graduates of other universities who will receive degrees, said that Australian graduates were held in the highest esteem in Britain because they were always prepared to make great sacrifices to attain the heights of their profession.

Dr. A. W. Hill stated that he had received such a hearty welcome in this State and Western Australia that he felt much at home.

He had been greatly impressed with the strides that had been made in the parts of the country he had visited. It was almost incredible that in such a short time the land which at no very distant date was virgin forest had been transformed into wheat areas.

Wonderful Institution

The Waite Agricultural Research Institute was a wonderful institution which would achieve important results of great benefit to the people of Australia. Its operations were being watched with keen interest in Britain.

Prof. Campbell said that there was a certain amount of regret with their meeting that day in that Mr. W. Fuller, after 47 years of service on the University staff had resigned. He felt sure that his interests would still be with the University.

In responding Mr. Fuller said that he joined the staff in 1881 as an assistant in the laboratory. In that year there were 15 graduates, 57 undergraduates, and four professors. Of the six University scholars then attending, one of them Sir George Murray, had risen to the position of Lieutenant-Governor, Chief Justice, and Chancellor of the University (Applause).

A son of the church, it is only fitting that the spare time of Mr. Shirley Williams Jeffries, M.P., LL.B., should be devoted to a religious institution. Mr. Jeffries takes a keen interest in the welfare of the Methodist Church of South Australia, and has represented it at its last four general conferences.

Born in Lancashire, England, 42 years ago, Mr. Jeffries when four years of age came to Australia with his father, the late Rev. William Jeffries, and his mother. After eight years in Queensland the family came to South Australia. The father of Mr. Jeffries was subsequently stationed at Kadina, Broken Hill, and various suburbs of Adelaide.

Mr. Jeffries was educated at Prince Alfred College and the University of Adelaide. At the latter institution he took his degree of Bachelor of Laws in 1909. Sport also claimed his attention while at the University. He represented it in inter-university contests in tennis and football. He also played A Grade football with Norwood, and with the Hon. L. L. Hill (Leader of the Opposi-

tion in the House of Assembly) was a playing member when that team in 1907 won the premiership of Australia.

Mr. Jeffries served his articles with the legal firm of Bakewell, Stow, & Piper. He became associated with Sir Frederick Young in his practice, and afterward joined Messrs. Fisher & Powers. The firm is now known as Fisher, Powers and Jeffries.

Mr. Jeffries was elected as a Liberal candidate for North Adelaide at the last elections for the House of Assembly, winning a seat which had not been held by the Liberals for 17 years.

He holds many executive positions among which are membership on the boards of the Young Men's Christian Association, Prince Alfred College, and Methodist Ladies' College. He is also president of the Adelaide Competitive Choir.

AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH

Legislation to Extend

Great interest by agriculturists is attached to the Bill which the Hon. R. L. Butler (Premier) will explain in the Assembly relating to the extension of agricultural research.

It is probable that in this measure the Government will seek to enlarge the scope of the Waite Agricultural Research Institute. The appointment of an entomologist is one of the points which may be included.

It is also stated that the Government will make a grant to the Adelaide University of £5,000 for further research work with progressive increases up to £15,000. It is considered that such valuable work has been achieved by the Waite Agricultural Institute that its labors should not be confined but helped to expand.
