

The family of Tetonganga
 accessed at 68 n.f.a.
 (unattested)

Teman came from the eastern side of the ancestral Tree of Tamaoa. He wed Mei Kauana and their daughter was Mei Bukeke. Tinoka came from the western side and married Mei Buranikaiua. Their son, Tetonganga wed Mei Bukeke.

Tetonganga went from Tamaoa to Aorae which was not settled and had children there - Teannaki and his sister, Mei Mareue. Mei Mareue roamed all over Aorae. She went north and met Tanimasang; she met Tanimaniaki in the south; Tanimaco in the west; and Tanimainiki in the east. They made her pregnant and her mother called her, beat her all over, snuffed and pummeled her. Tetonganga and his family moved on and made her bathe near Nambauan. When the child was born, it was named Namoni Keaki and in due course he married Mei Maui.

Mei Maui used to bathe in the sea and was seduced by a man called Tewannaka. Her husband asked her how she had become pregnant but she wouldn't tell him. The child was born and named Tetonganga the younger. When the older folk were dead (Namoni) Keaki said to his wife, 'My son is about to leave us' and Tetonganga departed to the east. He did not pray there because Uakeia and Kaitu were there before him so he got Taburitokia and the people of Tangea to build (a canoe) for him. He went to live at Arinibonora, took Mei Rereua as his wife and had a family.

When Tabaki's canoe was leaving, Tetonganga went with it, leaving his wife and son behind. That son was Kirata who married Kotie and their descendants were:
